Pastel Supply List - Marsha Hamby Savage

Essentials:

- **Portable easel** (prefer standing). If tables are not provided, bring a TV tray.

Soft Pastels - Not oil pastels - <u>Bring what you have</u>. Not your whole set up – or your whole studio! Imagine a "smiley" face here! Be as portable as possible!
If you "need" to purchase here are <u>my suggestions</u>:

- *Terry Ludwig* one of the softest and the backbone of my paintings.
- **Nupastel** one of the hardest pastels (or something similar)

- Others: <u>Rembrandt</u> (half stick set is good) one of the hardest; <u>Unison</u> middle soft, lovely pastels; <u>Schminke</u> - very soft, but rather neutral in their colors; <u>Sennelier</u> -very soft, crumbly except in the half stick sets - wonderful, <u>Girault</u> – soft, and small size, wonderful also... there are many other brands. Bring what you have unless you want to purchase something to add to your selection.

<u>Something to pastel on</u>: Sizes - prefer 11x14, 9x12, 8x10 (like larger, that is fine) <u>Ampersand Pastel Board</u> - my favorite (white or grey) – reason is you do not have to tape paper to a piece of foam core and/or hinge it to frame it!

Sanded Papers: Art Spectrum (love the darker ones, please don't bring green); Others: *Uart, Canson, Richeson*, many others

- Backing board if you use paper (but I role up artist tape and stick my board to it also! — such as foam core, or other lightweight art board larger than your paper.
- Tape: artist, drafting or painter's tape, this is "low tack" and can be removed easily
- Sketch book Pencils (#2 will do) Kneaded eraser ruler scissors
- Tracing Paper pad (11x14) to put on your pieces when you leave
- brush any stiff painting brush will do to brush off mistakes
- brush for doing under paintings (soft one of any kind not too small please)
- denatured alcohol for under paintings; small jar with lid to put it in
- floor towel for dropped pastel hand towel to wipe your hands -
- hand wipes and/or fingernail brush would be nice!
- barrier cream or gloves (you don't have to, but makes clean up easier)
